

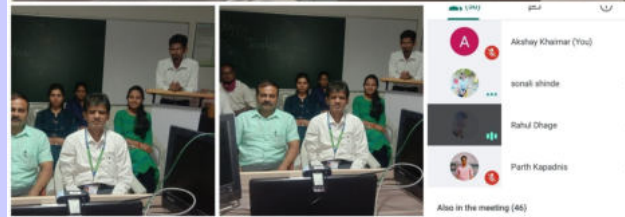
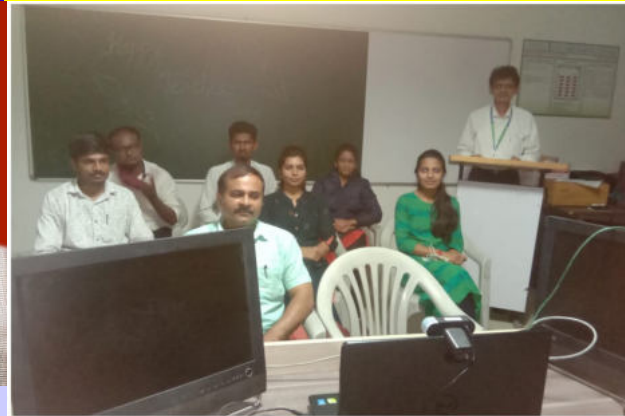

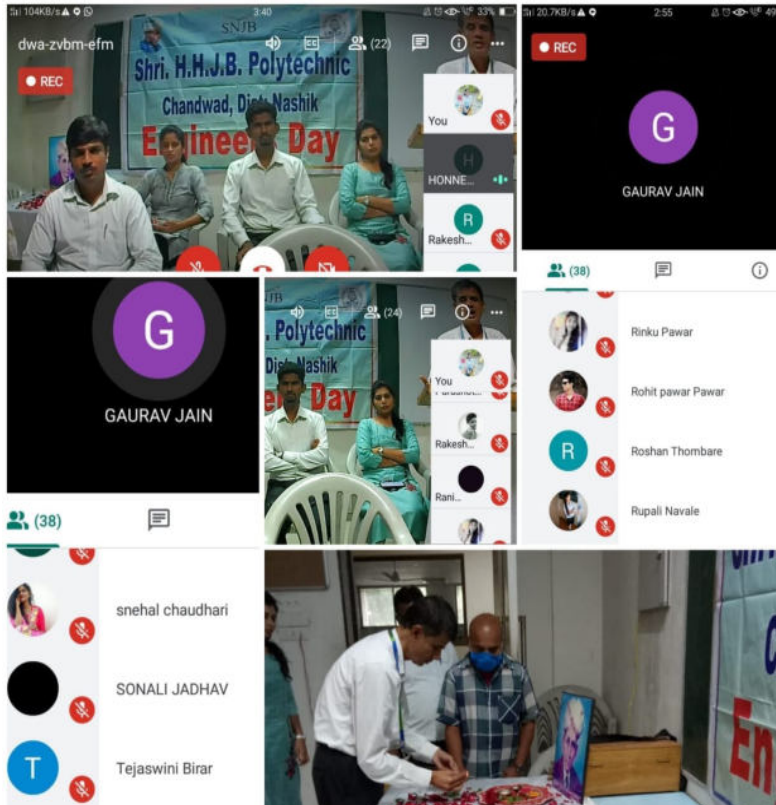

Engineer's day 2021: Every year on September 15, India along with Sri Lanka and Tanzania celebrate National Engineer's day to recognise and honour the achievements of the great engineer **Mokshagundam Visvesvaraya**. The day is observed to commemorate the great work of engineers and to encourage them for improvement and innovation.

M Visvesvaraya who was born on September 15, 1861, in the Muddenahalli village of Karnataka. He completed his school education in his hometown and later went to study Bachelor of Arts (BA) from the University of Madras. However, he changed his career path after graduating and pursued civil engineering at the College of Science in Pune.

Popularly known as Sir MV, Visvesvaraya undertook many complex projects and delivered remarkable infrastructural results during his career. He patented and installed an irrigation system with water floodgates at the Khadakvasla reservoir near Pune to raise the food supply level and storage to the highest levels know as 'block system' in 1903.

This was also installed at Gwalior's Tigra Dam and Mysuru's Krishnaraja Sagara (KRS) dam, the latter of which created one of the largest reservoirs in Asia at the time.

For his contribution to the building of India, the government awarded him with India's highest honor 'Bharat Ratna' in 1955.
